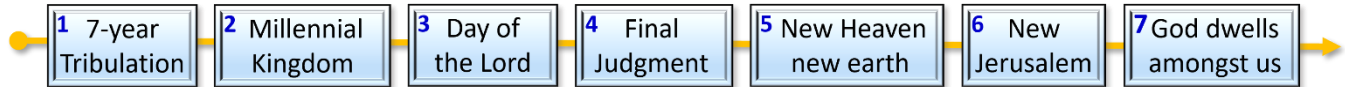




Bible Study

Thought-Provoking Questions

The purpose of the questions is to facilitate a deeper understanding of the Bible, this Bible study topic, and ourselves. The questions may be answered by each reader, or used by a Bible study group leader, or church pastor. The questions should be answered or discussed after reading the lesson. In addition, the questions are designed to enhance learning via the determination of personal opinions and discovering how the lesson content relates to our personal lives. Questions

- ① What do you think is God's overall objective in allowing the 7-year Tribulation to occur?
- ① What do you think are the three most significant changes that will occur during the Millennial Reign of Jesus Christ?
- ① Why do you think God would allow the release of Satan at the end of the Millennial Reign of Jesus Christ?
- ① Are there similarities to the activities and demise of Satan at the end of the 7-year Tribulation and at the end of the Millennial Reign of Jesus Christ?
- ① What words would you use to describe the Day of the Lord to someone who has never heard of it before?
- ① Do you think all persons will go through the Great White Throne Judgment, or only those who are destined to the lake of fire? Explain.
- ① Jesus was aware of the excruciating physical pain from the torture and death He was about to experience. *"And He was withdrawn from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and prayed, saying, 'Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done.' Then an angel appeared to Him from heaven, strengthening Him. And being in agony, He prayed more earnestly. Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground."* Luke 22:41-44
 - What was the motivation of His heart when He prayed to God, *"Father, if it is your will, take this cup away from Me."*?
 - Who benefited by His obedience, and was this a determinate factor in Him praying for God's will be done?
 - When evaluating the underlying motivation of our heart for things we do for God...is it prudent to identify who will benefit from our works? If yes, why?
- ① Based upon your ability to visualize what God's word has promised, how would you describe three attributes of the new Heaven and Earth that reveal God's love for us?
- ① Identify aspects of the New Jerusalem that are amazing to you.
- ① The lesson states that it has always been God's desire to dwell within a loving relationship with His human creation. As you consider this declaration...does it change your perceptual understanding of history, the present, the future...and most important...your relationship with God?
